After serving 16 years in Virginia (Richmond, West Point, and Arlington) I was called to a ministry on these Outer Banks where we planted a new church in Southern Shores while building the ministry and adding on at Saint Andrew's by the Sea in Nags Head during a 14-year pastorate. Community ministry was emphasized with the aim of connecting neighbors in Christian fellowship through the love of Jesus. Community Suppers were organized by Della, providing meals to those who would benefit in breaking bread with others, honoring the fellowship of those who share the joy that Jesus is the Bread of Life. These meals brought people together whether "churched" or "unchurched", believers or not. This was the start of what is now called "Ruthie's Kitchen."

After raising three children on the Outer Banks, our professional lives changed. Della and I retired; Della from her practice in pediatric physical therapy and I from parish ministry. However, we found that retirement is not a biblical term! Putting on a new set of tires, "re-tiring", Della spearheaded and planted the seeds of a mission with Teresa Clarkin Green now realized in Cross Roads OBX.

Our aim... Befriending neighbors who are broken and lost; thrown off course by homelessness, addiction, incarceration, or other events. Simply put our mission is to build relationships that provide new direction and trust in God, themselves and others.
