Currently Randy is semi-retired, providing the opportunity to become involved with volunteerism and giving back to the community. He is actively associated with: Suffer-No-More (suicide prevention and intervention); Professional Aviation Board of Certification (pilot testing and certification); The Outer Banks Hospital; and The Elizabethan Gardens. While serving as a volunteer at the Room in The Inn, he became associated with a group of passionate and loving individuals who were working to establish a Christ-centered non-profit to help those in need and in crisis within our community - Cross Roads - which he now serves as President of the Board of Directors.
